Please provide a brief description of your activities in the following areas for the past five years.

- 1) Service (including the Faculty Senate): I have served as an appointed member to the UC since Fall 2017 and have continued on that committee since being dually elected in 2019; I am also on the Health Professions Advisory Committee and my College's Curriculum Committee and various recruiting events; I have completed a past service on the International Fee Scholarship Committee; I am a departmental academic advisor and director of undergraduate studies
- 2) Scholarship/Research: I am part of a multi-institutional grant funded by Department of State to implement American style education in the Middle East
- 3) Teaching: I teach undergraduates at the sophomore and senior level, averaging 5 or 6 courses per academic year (MECE 2334, MECE 4371, and occasionally MECE 3363 and Independent Studies)
